



## **Table Clinic Presentations Overview Requirements & Recommendations 2009 ACP Annual Session**

### **Overview**

A table clinic can be a presentation of research results, clinical outcomes, laboratory techniques, or topics of general interest to the American College of Prosthodontists' members and guests.

The table clinics will be in poster format similar to AADR/IADR. Bulletin boards will be provided. Tables will not be available for models and materials. No electrical outlets will be available. Commercial presentations are not appropriate for this session.

Applications are due **August 14, 2009**. Applicants registering after the deadline may present if space permits, but they **will not be eligible** to participate in the competitions.

### **Requirements:**

1. The title of the table clinic and the presenter's name(s) (maximum of 2 presenters) must be clearly displayed at the top of the poster.
2. Prior to the meeting, an e-mail notice of acceptance will be sent assigning a number to each table clinic. This number is to be clearly displayed at the top right corner of each poster.
3. The table clinic must be in poster form which can be secured with push pins to a bulletin board.
4. The poster must fit on a **4' x 8'** bulletin board and secured with push pins.
5. Text, photographs, diagrams, and charts must be large enough to be read from a distance of **three** feet.
6. Presentations must be limited to **five** minutes. The question-and-answer period which follows should allow for a repeat of the clinic every **10** minutes.

### **Recommendations:**

1. Table clinic subject matter should be current and relevant to the audience.
2. Table clinic topics should be supported with substantial documentation to ensure credibility.
3. A sequential series of photographs is the standard for a table clinic poster. In conjunction with models, materials, or equipment, 8 to 10 photographs are ample.
4. Photographs should be no smaller than 8" x 10" for ease of viewing.
5. The text should be consistent with the *Glossary of Prosthodontic Terms, 7<sup>th</sup> Edition*.
6. Handout materials, containing instructions, supply lists, and procedure diagrams, are helpful and appreciated by the audience.
