ACP Recognizes Three Prosthodontists for Original Research in 2014 John J. Sharry Research Competition

Dr. Aram Kim; Dr. Aurora Dibner; Dr. Sanjay Karunagaran Win Top Honors

CHICAGO — The American College of Prosthodontists (ACP) announced Aram Kim, DMD, MS, of the University of Illinois at Chicago



as the first-place winner of the John J. Sharry Research Competition. Aurora Dibner, DMD, BS, of the University of Connecticut Health Center won second place, and Sanjay Karunagaran, BDS, DDS, MSD, of the University of Tennessee was named third-place winner. Results were announced during the 44th Annual Session of the ACP held in New Orleans, Nov. 5-8. This year, more than 1,200 dental professionals attended the event.

The John J. Sharry Research Competition is held to stimulate and acknowledge original research in Prosthodontics by residents. Originally named the Prosthodontist Research Award, it was renamed in honor of ACP Past President Dr. John J. Sharry, a founding member of the ACP. Three winners have been recognized annually since 1976.
