Dr. John R. Agar Will Serve as Immediate Past President of the American College of Prosthodontists



CHICAGO — John R. Agar, DDS, MA, FACP, will serve as immediate past-president of the American College of Prosthodontists (ACP). His 2014-15 presidency was celebrated during the 44th Annual Session of ACP held in New Orleans from Nov. 5-8, 2014. Dr. Agar remains an active member of the ACP executive committee.

During his presidency, Dr. Agar energized members, authored positon statements for the College and expanded awareness in public relations for the Prosthodontic specialty by growing the ACP Spokespersons Network to 45 media trained prosthodontists. During his tenure, National Prosthodontics Awareness Week (NPAW) blossomed, earning media coverage such as a feature article in <u>USA Today</u>, "High Tech Teeth: Dentistry Is Going Digital" and <u>five local TV news segments in four states</u>. He empowered members to develop position papers on numerous pertinent subjects. Media mentions for Prosthodontists more than doubled from 4,000 to 8,000 during his tenure.

Dr. Agar was able to get the word Prosthodontist added to Microsoft's Spell Check during his 2013-14 presidency. His positive impact on the ACP remains, leaving behind a legacy of dedication, expertise and superb leadership.

Dr. Agar is a board-certified Prosthodontist, respected academic and well-loved professor at the University of Connecticut Health Center School of Dentistry's Department of Reconstructive Sciences.
