Dr. Julie A. Holloway Installed as Treasurer of the American College of Prosthodontists *Officers Installed During 44th Annual Session of the American College of Prosthodontists*



CHICAGO — <u>Julie A. Holloway, DDS, MS, FACP</u>, has been installed as treasurer of the American College of Prosthodontists (ACP). Dr. Holloway was sworn in during the 44th Annual Session of the ACP held in New Orleans from Nov. 5-8, 2014.

"I am honored to serve in this position for the American College of Prosthodontists – an institution that represents our profession to patients and dental colleagues alike," Dr. Holloway said. "I wish to continue the high standards and passion for our specialty that is the mission of The American College of Prosthodontists."

Dr. Holloway completed her dental and specialty training at the Ohio State University, earning a certificate in Prosthodontics in 1993 and an MS degree. She has practiced as a Prosthodontist in a university setting for 21 years, became board certified in 2009 and has served as graduate program director at the Ohio State University and the University of Iowa

College of Dentistry. She is professor and head of the Department of Prosthodontics at the University of Iowa College of Dentistry.

A member since 1993, Dr. Holloway has served on several committees and has been active in supporting the work of the College. She has served as a co-chair of the Postdoctoral Education Committee for five years and helped construct board preparation mock written examinations. Dr. Holloway has served as editor of the ACP Board Preparation Study Guide, carrying on the efforts of Drs. Hiroshi Hirayama and Kiho Kang. She has also helped define our specialty as a member of the CODA Revisions Task Force.

Dr. Holloway is a board-certified Prosthodontist who has authored and co-authored more than 35 peer-reviewed articles as well as three book chapters. She has been recognized for her expertise and passion, receiving the Academy of Osseointegration's Best Oral Research Presentation Award and the ACP's Clinician/Researcher Award. Dr. Holloway's leadership is also highly respected, as immediate past president of the American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics, past president of the Carl O. Boucher Prosthodontic Conference and as treasurer of the ACP. In 2014, she will join the ACP Spokespersons Network and help raise awareness for the specialty as a Prosthodontist.

"As a Prosthodontist, I just treated a patient with severe dental erosion, who required crowns on all of his teeth. He was a chicken farmer, and the cause of his erosion was interesting as it was likely due to his environment," Dr. Holloway said. "Many people think that teeth are simple; they actually are quite complex, particularly when oral health issues are left untreated or as new oral health issues emerge, requiring us to think out of the box. That's what I love about my role as a dental specialist – a Prosthodontist – the ability to restore a smile."

Prosthodontists are specialized dentists with advanced training in oral health issues, who are committed to improving patient outcomes. From implants, crowns, veneers and tooth whitening, to full-mouth reconstruction, Prosthodontists specialize in <u>digital dentistry</u> and CAD/CAM solutions. The ACP is the only Prosthodontic specialty organization whose membership is based solely on education credentials. ACP members must be in or have completed an ADA-accredited advanced education program in Prosthodontics.
