
Dr. James G. McCartney

Teasing people he really liked was one of his greatest pleasures; you knew he liked you if he teased you. Jim's intelligence was hard to miss, he was interested and curious about the world and always worked towards self-improvement. He was interested in science, physical and mental health, and spirituality. He was an avid reader and researched endless subjects.
