



Dr. Leonard R. Moore

Dr. Leonard R. Moore of Basking Ridge, N.J., a retired prosthodontist and diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics, passed away on April 9, 2016, opening day of fly fishing trout season, at 95 years old.

Dr. Moore was from Newark, N.J., and grew up in Union, N.J. He served (1943 to 1954) in the U.S. Army in World War II and the Korean War in the U.S. Public Health Service and as a captain in the U.S. Army Dental Corps. Dr. Moore started his practice in 1944 and retired in 1994. His academic appointments included Fairleigh Dickinson University Dental School (1957 to 1980). In 1973, he founded the prosthodontics program at FDU and was a clinical professor and the director of the department of post-graduate prosthodontics. His professional affiliations and past presidencies included the Union County Dental Society, N.J. Section, American College of Prosthodontics, N.J. Section, Omicron Kappa Upsilon, Greater N.Y. Academy of Prosthodontics, and N.J. Section American College of Dentists. Leonard is survived by his wife, Anne, of Basking Ridge; his daughter and son-in-law, Louise and Robert Solomon, D.P.M.; his daughter, Alice; son, William; grandson, Jaxon Solomon, all of Kinnelon, N.J., and his grandson, Maxwell Solomon of Horseshoe Bay, Texas.
